- Focuses on investing in “best of breed” companies with strong long-term business models and competitive advantages that can achieve sustainable long-term earnings leadership.

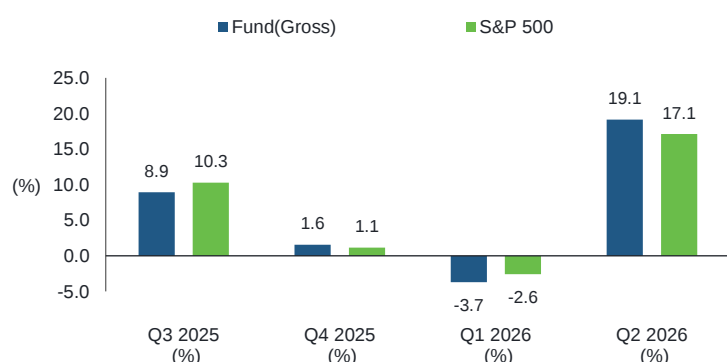

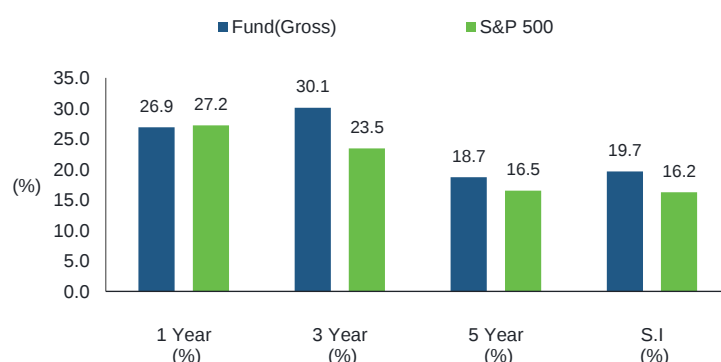

Quarterly Fund Commentary

- The Fund's lower-than-benchmark exposure to the consumer staples sector contributed to relative returns. In this sector, lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based retail company Walmart and to U.S.-based food and beverage company PepsiCo, contributed to relative returns.
- Investments in the communication services sector also contributed to relative returns. In this sector, an investment in U.S.-based internet and digital advertising company Alphabet, contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, an investment in U.S.-based semiconductor company Marvell Technology and out-of-benchmark exposure to Taiwan-based semiconductor foundry Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (TSMC), also contributed to relative returns.
- In contrast, the Fund's investments in the materials sector detracted from relative returns. In this sector, out-of-benchmark exposure to Canada-based gold mining company Orla Mining and to Canada-based royalty and streaming company Franco-Nevada, detracted from relative returns.
- Performance in the health care sector also detracted from relative returns. In this sector, lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based managed health care company and out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based medical technology company TransMedics Group, detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, higher-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based social media and digital advertising company Meta Platforms and to U.S.-based streaming entertainment company Netflix, also detracted from relative returns.

12 Month Fund Commentary

- The Fund's investments in the health care and consumer discretionary sectors detracted from relative returns. In the health care sector, an investment in U.S.-based medical device company Boston Scientific and lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based health care products company Johnson & Johnson, detracted from relative returns.
- In the consumer discretionary sector, out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based language-learning platform company Duolingo and an investment in U.S.-based e-commerce and cloud computing company Amazon.com, detracted from relative returns.
- In other sectors, higher-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based social media and digital advertising company Meta Platforms and to U.S.-based streaming entertainment company Netflix, also detracted from relative returns.
- In contrast, the Fund's investments in the information technology and industrials sectors contributed to relative returns. In the information technology sector, out-of-benchmark exposure to Taiwan-based semiconductor foundry Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (TSMC) and lower-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based software company Microsoft, contributed to relative returns.
- In the industrials sector, higher-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based power and electrification equipment company GE Vernova and out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based specialty metals manufacturer Carpenter Technology, contributed to relative returns.
- In other sectors, a higher-than-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based internet and digital advertising company, Alphabet, and a U.S.-based manufacturer of electronic interconnect, Amphenol Corp, also contributed to relative returns.

Positioning and Outlook

- Fidelity Insights Class is a diversified U.S. equity strategy with a large-cap growth orientation, managed by Will Danoff, Nidhi Gupta, and Matthew Drukker. The team shares a common investment philosophy that stock prices ultimately follow earnings, focusing on high-quality, best-of-breed companies with durable competitive advantages and strong cash-flow generation. Periods of volatility are viewed as opportunities to add to leading franchises positioned to compound value over long-term market cycles.
- The managers remain focused on durable, high-quality growth companies, using periods of volatility to reinforce their highest-conviction positions, consistent with prior market dislocations. Earnings fundamentals have remained resilient despite geopolitical and macro uncertainty, providing confidence to maintain exposure to companies with strong cash-flow generation, pricing power, and attractive long-term valuations.
- Equity markets have remained resilient despite a weaker economic backdrop and elevated geopolitical uncertainty, supported by continued corporate earnings strength that is increasingly extending beyond a narrow group of AI-focused leaders. While geopolitical developments, trade policy uncertainty, and evolving macroeconomic conditions may contribute to periods of market volatility, particularly as valuations in certain areas leave less room for disappointment, the portfolio managers remain focused on company-specific fundamentals. Corporate profitability and earnings momentum have remained robust, providing support for a constructive investment backdrop and creating opportunities for bottom-up stock selection across a broader range of sectors and industries.
- The team continues to invest in key structural themes, most notably AI, with an emphasis on companies benefiting from the data-center buildout and semiconductor supply chain rather than end-market software exposure. Complementing this, the portfolio has selectively expanded into industrials, materials, and consumer discretionary areas where earnings durability is improving and could be less susceptible to near-term disruption, supported by insights from Fidelity's global research platform and ongoing company engagement.
- As periodic volatility has the potential to create attractive entry points for long-term equity positions. The managers continue to maintain a long-term investment horizon, selectively adding to core holdings while broadening exposure to sectors demonstrating improving fundamentals. This balanced approach preserves meaningful exposure to companies driving secular innovation, while positioning the Fund to benefit from a widening opportunity set as more sectors contribute to earnings growth over time.
- During the quarter, the portfolio managers changed the Fund's positioning to take advantage of market conditions. At the sector level, the portfolio managers increased exposure to information technology and industrials, while reducing exposure to communication services and financials. At the end of the quarter, the Fund's largest sector exposures were to information technology and communication services.

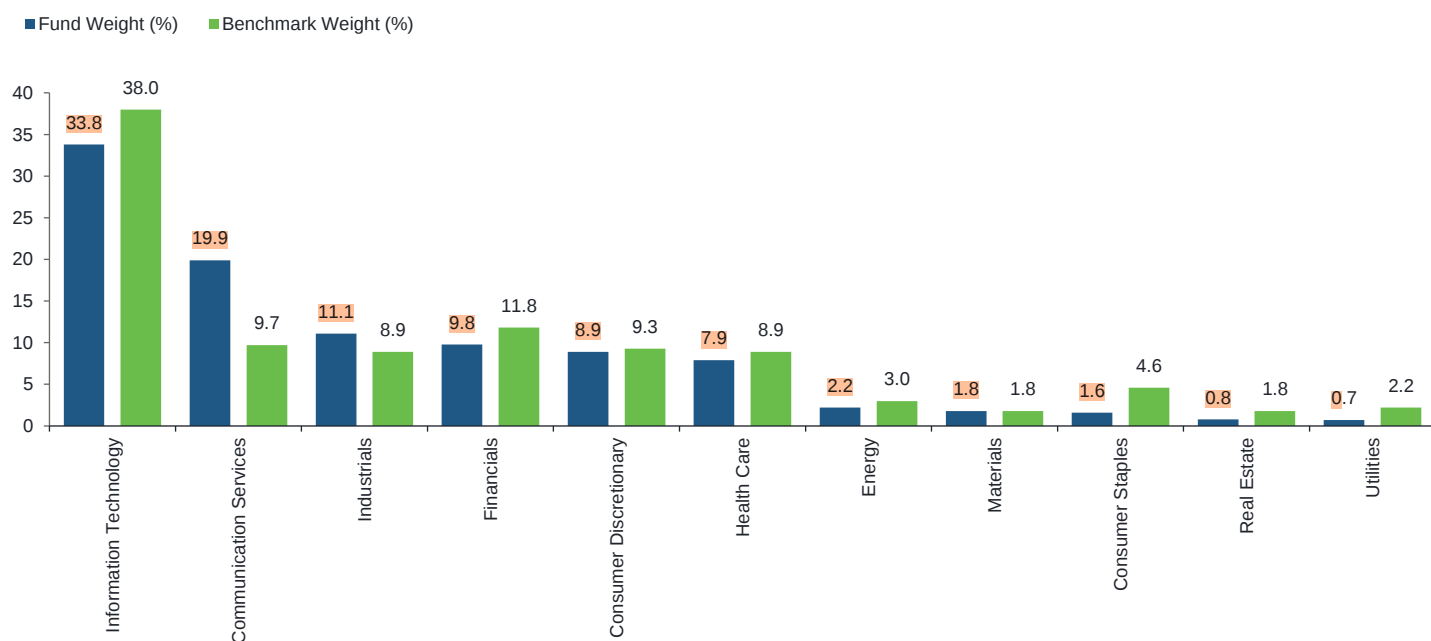

The Fund aims to invest in high quality U.S. equities that maintain global market leadership in their respective industries and provide sustainable long-term earnings strength. Portfolio manager Will Danoff's investment strategy focuses on understanding "best of breed" companies with strong long-term business models and competitive advantages that can enable sustainable long-term growth leadership. The Fund is a Diversified equity fund with a large-growth bias that emphasizes investing in firms with high return on capital, solid free cash flow generation, prudently managed balance sheets, and less economically sensitive. These are the companies the portfolio manager believes are poised for durable multiyear earnings growth with superior business models.
